The qualifying exam is usually given after one year of graduate study beyond the M.S. degree. For students entering the PhD program without an M.S. Degree, the qualifying exam may be administered after two years of graduate study. However, the student must consult with their faculty advisor and/or the exam coordinator in the major area of study for the schedule and specific procedures. A letter and/or signature form verifying that a student passed the qualifying exam must be signed by the student's advisor/committee and returned to the Graduate Student Services Coordinator.
