QR codes

Use a QR code to quickly and easily direct readers to registration sites, articles, websites, and more. Canva has a built-in QR code generator. You can also create them in Google Chrome.

Software for creating your announcement

You may use PowerPoint to create your announcement, but <u>Canva</u> is highly recommended as a more robust alternative. There are free and paid options to suit all needs.

Logo size

Make sure logos are sized appropriately to ensure legibility. See campus guidance on institutional and department logos for details.

Headline

A concise call to action makes it easy to focus understand the announcement.

Image use & negative space

Don't underestimate the power of simplicity in graphic design.

Use images sparingly (1-2 max is suggested) incorporate and negative/blank space to keep your graphic readable.

Use high-quality images that you own or have permission to use. If you don't have permission, ask before using to avoid copyright issues.

Supporting text

Use plain language strategies and keep supporting text to a few brief sentences that a reader can scan in passing. Avoid large chunks of text that require more focus because they are not as easy to read and comprehend in a short time frame.
